I know each and everyone of us will prove ourselves worthy of that confidence because we firmly believe in the principles of democracy for which we are fighting.

In this and other of our future assignments we must always have before our minds that our enemy is a strong and wily foe, that no quarter will be asked nor given. We must also remember that in successfully accomplishming our mission we are avenging the loss of our shipmates in past actions. This is not a one man job, each and everyone of us must know and do their job. There is no luck in this work, but plain hard work, hard fighting, common sense, and carrying our share of the load. Our load is a big one, but our lives, the lives of our shipmates around us and the lives of our dear ones at home, makes that load worthy of everything we have to put into the effort to make this a successful venture.
